About the Congress

The 9th Infection Control Africa Network (ICAN) Congress: Advancing IPC and AMR for a Safer Tomorrow

ICAN 2025 will take place at the Cape Town International Convention Centre (CTICC) from Sunday, 29 June to Wednesday, 2 July and will comprise 3 congress days plus 1 day of focussed pre-congress workshops.

Since 2015, ICAN has grown and become the voice of Infection Prevention and Control (IPC) in Africa with more than 2,118 from 54 countries across Africa and Europe.

ICAN trains professionals on infection control programmes and has developed 5 hubs across Africa to ensure that IPC training is available around the continent.

The Infection Control Africa Network (ICAN) exists to:

- Promote and facilitate the establishment of infection control programmes
- Promote and facilitate the achievement and maintenance of infection reduction, including healthcare-associated infections
- Promote antimicrobial stewardship activities through education by working with infection prevention structures in Africa and other international healthcare-related associations



Who Attends the ICAN Congress?

ICAN Congress participants are a diverse group united by a common goal to improve health outcomes through effective infection prevention strategies. Participants typically include:



HEALTHCARE PROFESSIONALS:

Nurses, physicians, infection control practitioners, and clinical microbiologists who are involved in patient care and infection prevention.



PUBLIC HEALTH OFFICIALS:

Epidemiologists and public health workers focussed on disease prevention and control.



HEALTHCARE ADMINISTRATORS:

Managers and executives responsible for hospital policy and infection control protocols.



RESEARCHERS AND ACADEMICS:

Individuals involved in infectious disease research, including those from universities and research institutions.



ENVIRONMENTAL SERVICES PROFESSIONALS:

Staff responsible for sanitation and hygiene in healthcare settings.



ARCHITECTS, DESIGNERS, ENGINEERS & QUANTITY SURVEYORS

involved in the development and provision of healthcare facilities.



PHARMACEUTICAL AND MEDICAL DEVICE REPRESENTATIVES:

Those promoting products related to infection control, such as disinfectants and protective equipment.



REGULATORY AND ACCREDITATION BODIES:

Representatives from organisations that set guidelines and standards for infection control.



THE QUADRIPARTITE PARTNERS:

Representatives of the UN Food and Agriculture Organization, the UN Environment Programme, the World Health Organization, and the World Organisation for Animal Health involved in addressing AMR.



STUDENTS AND TRAINEES:

Individuals pursuing careers in healthcare or public health who want to learn more about infection control.


